ANDREWS, LORING—No. 98 (1799–1875).
Member of the Chamber, 1865–1875;
hide and leather merchant, established
in New York in 1829; associated with
Gideon Lee and Sheppard Knapp; first
president of the Shoe and Leather Bank;
portrait presented by his family, painted
in 1886 by Robert Gordon Hardie.

APPLETON, DANIEL F.—No. 192 (1846–
1904). Member of the Chamber, 1875
–77; 1892–1904; entered business with
Royal E. Robbins, importer of watches;
in 1857 organized and established
American Waltham Watch Co.; por-
trait presented by his sons, painted in
1905 by Joseph DeCamp after East-
man Johnson.

ARTHUR, CHESTER A.—No. 201 (1830–
1886). Honorary member of the Cham-
ber, 1885–1886; President of the United
States, 1881–1885; practiced law; con-
ducted noted legal cases in defense of
the colored race; served in the Civil
