Appleton, Daniel F.—No. 192 (1846–1904). Member of the Chamber, 1875–77; 1892–1904; entered business with Royal E. Robbins, importer of watches; in 1857 organized and established American Waltham Watch Co.; portrait presented by his sons, painted in 1905 by Joseph DeCamp after Eastman Johnson.

ARTHUR, CHESTER A.—No. 201 (1830–1886). Honorary member of the Chamber, 1885–1886; President of the United States, 1881–1885; practiced law; conducted noted legal cases in defense of the colored race; served in the Civil
