COBDEN, RICHARD—No. 67 (1804–1865). British statesman and merchant; diligent student of political science and economy; business was manufacturing and printing of calicoes; founder of the Anti-Corn Law League, 1839; member of the British Parliament, 1841; devoted himself to repeal of Corn Laws; portrait presented by Morris Ketchum, painted in 1860 from life by J. Fagnani.

✓ CODDINGTON, THOMAS B.—No. 95 (1814–1886). Member of the Chamber, 1858–86; at 15 entered office of James A. Moore, white lead merchant; established himself in the metal business in 1835; became widely known in the trade; portrait presented by his daughters, painted in 1886 by Eastman Johnson.

COE, GEORGE S.—No. 170 (1817–1896). Member of the Chamber, 1859–96; Chairman, Committee on Finance and Currency, 1884–95; entered service of Prime, Ward & King in 1838, then the leading banking firm in the country; transferred to the American Exchange
