MRS. J. R. KILPATRICK DIES AT HOME HERE

Mrs. Stephanie Hengster Kilpatrick, wife of John Reed Kilpatrick, chairman of the board of Madison Square Garden and chairman of National Citizens for Eisenhower, died of a heart attack yesterday at her home, 350 Park Avenue.

Mrs. Kilpatrick was born in Doboj, Bosnia, now in Yugoslavia, the daughter of Rosa and Franz Hengster. She studied at a convent in the town of Dervent. Her marriage to Fitzroy Dellan Raymond, an Englishman, terminated in divorce, and she later settled in France.

It was while she was living in Paris, in March, 1919, that she met Mr. Kilpatrick, then a colonel with the American Expeditionary Forces. They were married in October, 1919, at Mr. Kilpatrick's family home in Toms River, N. J.

Besides her husband, she leaves a daughter by her former marriage, Miss Margaret Raymond; a daughter by her second marriage, Mrs. William W. Field; and four grandchildren.

H. E. RONDTHALER, MORAVIAN BISHOP

WINSTON-SALEM, N. C., Oct. 22 (AP)—Bishop Howard E. Rondthaler, spiritual leader of the Southern Moravian Church and for many years president of Salem College here, died tonight. His age was 85.

He was born in Brooklyn, New York, the son of Edward and Mary Rondthaler. His father was also a Moravian Bishop. He came to Salem with his parents in 1877, when his father became pastor of the Salem congregation of the Moravian Church, a post he held until his death in 1931.

C. W. P. ROBERTS, LAWYER, WAS 66

Assistant General Attorney for Western Union Dies—With Concern Since '41

Clarence William Putnam Roberts, assistant general attorney for the Western Union Telegraph Company since 1941, died Sunday in St. Francis Hospital, the Bronx, after a short illness. He was 66 years old and lived at the Country Club Garden Apartments, Pelham Manor, N. Y. His office was at 80 Hudson Street here.

Mr. Roberts was descended from John Putnam, who settled in Salem, Mass., in 1628, and was related to Maj. Gen. Israel Putnam and Brig. Gen. Rufus Putnam, both American Revolutionary heroes. He received an A. B. degree from the University of Michigan in 1910 and a law degree there the next year.

He was formerly a secretary in the Appellate Division, New York State Supreme Court, First Department, here, and also was in private law practice. He was an Assistant United States Attorney in the Southern District of New York from 1934 to 1941.

In World War I Mr. Roberts served in the General Staff Military Intelligence of the Army in Washington, with the rank of first lieutenant.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Ruth Y. Dowd Roberts; two daughters, Sisters Maryam and Mary Roso; five sons, the Rev. Raymond, the Rev. Rufus P., the Rev. William P. and the Rev. A. P. Roberts, and Clarence P. Roberts, and a brother, Howard Roberts.

FRED B. LEGGETT, 66, HEADED STORE CHAIN

DANVILLE, Va., Oct. 22 (AP)—Fred Bennett Leggett, merchant who headed the fifty-four-store chain of Leggett Department Stores in five states, died in a hospital here today. His age was 66.

In declining health for four years, Mr. Leggett had run his business from his hospital room much of the time. He suffered loss of a leg about two years ago in a bedroom fire.

Mr. Leggett studied agriculture at North Carolina State College. He left college to work with the Belk Brothers in their Monroe, N. C., store and then at Charlotte. When the United States entered World War I, Mr. Leggett joined the Army.

Back from the war, he came to Danville and opened the first of the Belk-Leggett Stores in late 1918. In association with his four brothers, they began to expand the Leggett Stores in Virginia, North Carolina, West Virginia, Maryland and Ohio until they became the largest affiliates of the Belk organization. Fred Leggett was president of the corporate group.

Surviving are his widow, Suzanne; a son, Fred Bennett Leggett Jr., and a daughter, Sue Howard Leggett, all of Danville, and two sisters, and two brothers.

MRS. SCHERMERHORN OF PULLMAN FAMILY

Mrs. Harriett Pullman Schermerhorn of 71 East Seventy-first Street, widow of Col. Arthur Frederic Schermerhorn, died on Sunday at St. Luke's Hospital. She was the last surviving child of the late George Mortimer Pullman, inventor of the Pullman car, and of the late Mrs. Harriett Sanger Pullman. Her age was 87.

Mrs. Schermerhorn was first married to Francis J. Carolan, a San Francisco financier, in 1892. He died in 1923. Two years later, his widow married Colonel Schermerhorn, a direct descendant of Jacob Janse Schermerhorn, who came here from the Netherlands in 1836. Colonel Schermerhorn served for fifty years in the New York National Guard. He died in 1933.

Mrs. Schermerhorn, who inherited much of the Pullman fortune, had been active in recent years as an official of the Outdoor Cleanliness Association. As its honorary president, she sometimes presided at the association's annual flower mart, held each spring on the steps of St. Patrick's Cathedral. She had won several prizes for her flower arrangements.

Mrs. Schermerhorn's father died in 1897 and her mother in 1921. She was predeceased also by her twin brothers, George and Sanger Pullman, and by a sister, Florence, who became the wife of the late Gov. Frank O. Lowden of Illinois.
