Dear Leo,

First of all let me wish you a very happy holiday season and a healthy and prosperous 1976.

If you will be in New York next week, and if you are able to take a look at the new Lichtenstein tapestry, it will be in our gallery at the first part of the week before being sent to a client in Florida who would like to have it on approval.

As you probably know Roy came by last week and signed the tapestry which he entitled: ABSTRACTION. He asked that we make a few changes which will be incorporated into the second tapestry in the edition as well as all the others.

The size of the tapestry is 5' 4" in height and 6' 7½" in width and the retail price is listed at \$ 12,000. We have had the tapestry photographed, and as soon as the slides are ready we will send you a supply.

It was arranged with Roy that his maquette for the first wool tapestry would be delivered to your gallery for him which we will do as soon as we have checked where the delivery should be made.

Our little matter with Jack Glenn goes forward without substantial results, but we are now free to sell the works which have been consigned to us. The Warhol painting and the Lichtenstein drawing are being sent from California and should be in New York the first week of the new year. The Rosenquist drawing which you now have downtown can also be sold so perhaps we can finally realize some money from this affair after all this time.
